Review of October's Action Items:

- Organize Google drive and make sure everyone has access to be able to share documents.
 Tabled Susan brought up that we could consider who uses the drive most often, (Gretchen) and get their input about how best to organize it.
- Hassan will share with board an online link to a digital version of the CSCB manual. He did
- Hassan will inquire with CSCB to see what we can learn about Bylaws updates. –CSCB does not
 wish to publish the analysis or findings of their recent survey of the bylaws of Colorado's
 Conservation districts, but offered Hassan access to a new bylaws template formed from their
 study Action Item Hassan will look the documents over to see if there is any new considerations
 to adopt, or change.
- Greg and David met to discuss Tree pricing in 2021. The new pricing structure has been decided and a new form has been made; and available for all that have inquired. Orders are already coming in. The State Forestry department helped us with some new flyers and Greg will make sure they are posted all over town. Greg mentioned purchasing several 15 second mentions on KSJD for \$7 each, and it will be a good idea to reach our customers. The board agreed and added that the Empire electric publication and the Free Press might be money well spent as well. Motion to approve \$200 for Greg to use at his discretion for Tree Sales advertising by Adam, seconded by Hassan- Passed
- Action Item Hassan will work with Greg and Gretchen to get us a short list of our best Grant
 options.
- Look at website for changes that will make it more complete, and help us get our message across:
 A search of the web finds two websites for HDCD; This can be very confusing to our audience,
 and could be a detriment to our mission. We don't have the need or resources to update two
 websites. Action Item Greg will work with Haley to see what it will take to remove the old
 website.

OFFICER REPORTS

President – Suzanne Aikin: The San Juan Basin watershed meeting is coming up soon, our attendance is encouranged. Hassan became CACD's treasurer at the last meeting. Their annual meeting is next week and Suzanne gave our proxy to Mancos on this boards behalf. We have \$340 left from of the COVID relief funds Suzanne applied for earlier in 2020. Greg agreed to use the funds to improve his home office conditions and connectivity, and possibly pay the ZOOM bill for the year. Motion to approve COVID funds spent on Greg's home office by Adam, seconded by Hassan- Passed. Greg will

inspect the printer in the District shed to see if it can benefit his home office. HDCD is paying for internet at the NRCS office and Greg has been using it only part of the time. COVID funds should be able to be used for HDCD to purchase internet signal for Greg's home office.

- Treasurer Hassan Hourmanesh sent out the budget update; which (Action Item) will have to be approved at our next meeting (December 8th). Hassan is interested in looking into Grant options for HDCD and will consult with Gretchen about our most promising options and bring them back to our board for further discussion.

STAFF REPORTS

- NRCS Joel Lee: The office went through a quarantine and is still operating safely and incident free. COVID pandemic is a fluid situation and his office has done a great job with adapting while getting good work done. The continuing resolution looms over their certainty in mid December.
- DM Greg Vlaming- The retail side is doing well. The nozzle exchange program has SWCD providing contributions for materials again next cycle, CSCB has money to help, and DWCD has \$5000 to cover operations. Greg has been talking with Bonnie Loving about partnerships for Grant opportunities with HDCD, and MCD; a Deadline exists in December. Bonnie has a county newcomer packet, which will cost \$40 to organize and print, Greg thinks it is a good idea. Motion to approve \$40 spent on newcomer packet made by Hassan, seconded by Adam -Passed

Action item Susan will look into our options and see if it an option for HDCD to pick up the M.I,M torch that used to be carried by a different organization.
- How to best use and track Cory's HDCD time (20%) Greg will talk with Cory about raising awareness for the district among our constituents and ask him to wear our hat when serving in the community. **Action Item** The board could work on our Elevator speech to clearly and concisely explain our complicated relationship with our community.
